PARENT PAYMENT ARRANGEMENTS 2021 – GRADE 2

Dear Parent/Caregiver

Albert Park Primary School is proud of the quality of our educational program, the range of activities and the facilities we provide for our students. So that we can continue to offer the best possible teaching and learning environment we are seeking your per student education contribution for the 2021 school year.

These payments fall into the following categories:

- **Essential Student Learning Items** - classroom materials that your child will use including software licences.
- **Voluntary Financial Contributions (parent contributions)** - a per child donation to the school to ensure we are adequately funded to meet our school families' educational expectations. Your financial support enables us to provide a wide range of programs and enhance our resources such as digital technologies, library and facilities that are not otherwise provided for through the Department's Student Resource Package.
- **Excursion / Incursion** - including school camps. As of 2021, these will be advised throughout the year for payment individually via Compass.

The Department of Education and Training provides funding to Albert Park Primary School for the standard curriculum program only. Our school receives the lowest possible level of funding which results in a substantial shortfall between our level of government funding and the money needed to provide an exceptional education for our students. Your voluntary, per child, parent contribution of \$300 covers this shortfall.

School Supplies and Sustainability

At Albert Park Primary School, we are committed to becoming carbon neutral and more sustainable under the direction of the Wurru Wurru Sustainable School Alliance "WWSSA". As we transition to a more sustainable school model, the following items will be moved with the student to their new class level for the following year: **pencil cases, plastic reading/communication folders and headphones**, providing they are still in good working condition. If these items need to be replaced, they can now be purchased via Compass.

In consideration of the events of 2020 the due date for full payment of school fees has been extended this year to 29 January 2021.

Financial Support for Families

APPS understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund.
- A second-hand uniform shop that is available at school. Please ask at the office.
- State Schools Relief. This is an organisation associated with schools, who can supply school uniforms, books and shoes to eligible students. Again, ask at the office for more information.
- Payment/instalment plans.

- BPay – individual reference number is on your Family Statement.

If not paying by Compass please make payment and return the completed form to the school office by **29 January 2021**.

APPS Refund Guidelines


Listed below are the guidelines we follow:

- Where Albert Park Primary School is charged for an activity or service as a bulk cost, no refund can be given.
- Where a per student fee is charged, a refund can be given.
- Where there is a bus component a refund cannot be given on that cost.
- Any request for a refund must be sent to albert.park.ps@education.vic.gov.au within 14 days of the activity.
- Where Albert Park Primary School has paid a 3rd party and there is no refund available from them, Albert Park Primary School is not able to offer a refund.



Excursions/Incursions

This has changed and will now be charged at the time of the incursion / excursion and will be advised separately throughout the year via Compass.

Optional Items

APPS offers a range of optional items and activities that are additional to the delivery of the standard curriculum. These items and activities are designed to broaden the school experience for your child.

Payment for these activities will be requested closer to the event. Students who choose not to attend these events will remain in class and receive explicit teaching to the relevant curriculum.

PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW

The following is a summary of the main principles of the Parent Payments Policy:



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements as outlined in the Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

- Schools do not ask parents to pay for school operating costs (eg utility costs) or general and unspecified charges.
- Schools request payments from parents under three categories:

Essential Student Learning Items

- Items and activities which the school deems essential for student learning.
- Parents may choose to purchase essential items through the school or provide their own.

Optional Items

- Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are offered in addition to the standard curriculum.
- These are provided to students on a user-pays basis.

Voluntary Contributions

- Voluntary contributions support the school to continue to be the best local school for all students and can be for general or specific purpose.
- Students will not be disadvantaged in any way if parents do not make a contribution.



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and upload their arrangements on their school's public website for transparency.
