# Primary Mathematics and Science Specialist Initiative

Mathematics and Science are fundamental subjects that help children develop critical thinking, problem-solving, and analytical skills. It is also an essential component of many career paths, including engineering, science, technology, finance and even in the arts. Therefore, it is essential that our children have a strong foundation in Maths from an early age.

This year, our school was successful in securing the opportunity to take part in the Primary Mathematics and Science Specialist Initiative (PMSSI). PMSSI is focused on whole school improvement including professional learning for teachers and school leaders. The aim is to develop the essential mathematical knowledge for teaching and classroom practices that will support sustainability for our school.

In Australia, there has been a decline in girls pursuing further study or careers in Maths and Science. At Albert Park Primary School, we strive to ensure that all students, particularly girls, are passionate and have the best opportunities to reach their full potential in these subjects.

We are fortunate to have three teachers from our school taking part in the initiative: Catherine Shepherd (Prep), Michael Logan (Grade 5) and Will Davey (Grade 4). Together, We are building on the school's success in these areas and continue to create learning environments where all students feel supported and encouraged to explore their mathematical abilities.

We are so lucky to have a supportive community of parents and carers who play an active role in their children's maths education. Families can help by encouraging children to explore Maths in everyday situations and reinforcing the importance of Maths or scientific skills in their children's future academic and career success. Below are some great books you might like to read with your child:



The activity below is an opportunity to have a Mathematical discussion with your child. For younger students, you could discuss what they can see including patterns, colours and numbers. For older students, you could discuss odd and even numbers or the total amounts of the numbers in each group.



Could you think of mathematical reasons why each of the groups could be the odd one out?
