

Louis: I liked going into the first mate's room. A first mate is a person that can replace the captain if something happens to the captain.



At APPS we encourage "Nude Food". This means bringing lunches to school in washable containers without single-use plastic wrappings. Here are some ideas:


- Buy large bags of popcorn and place popcorn directly into lunchboxes rather than buying individual packets.

From the Art Room














