School Assistance Fund: This fund is to provide Curriculum consumables or Extra-Curricular Items and Activities for families at our school unable to purchase these items due to demonstrated financial hardship. Your contribution helps to ensure that all our students have the option of attending excursions, incursions, school camps and swimming programs and have the items they need for school. School Nurse: This service is not provided by most Government primary schools and is entirely dependent on parent funding. While many schools have a trained first aid assistant, our school has fully qualified nurse.  We have a fully qualified Nurse on duty every day from 10.30 – 2.30 pm, seeing on average 30-40 students each day across all year levels. This not only means your children are treated by a medical professional but also ensures teachers are not managing students' medical needs on a daily basis and can instead focus on student learning.  Role of our Nurse includes:  Providing First Aid/Materials  Allergy and anaphylactic medication and action plan management  One-on-one treatment discussions with Parents/Guardians  Regular training on EpiPen, asthma and first aid to all staff  Manage short term medication (i.e. Antibiotics)  Contagious infections notifications (i.e. headlice etc)  Other health and wellbeing management  Suggested amount is \$75 but we welcome any contribution.	\$75.00

### **Financial Support for Families**

Albert Park Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund Applications via school, families holding a valid meanstested concession card are eligible to apply. From 1 January 2026 eligible families will receive \$400 per year for primary school students. A special consideration category also exists for refugee and asylum seeker families and students placed in out of home care. CSEF payments will be processed directly to schools with the majority of payments to commence from March 2026 onwards. #### **FREE INSTRUCTION**



- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free
  access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the
  requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the
  Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the
  Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

### **PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS**

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



# Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

# Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

# Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



#### **FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES**

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



#### **SCHOOL PROCESSES**

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
